PERKINS HELP FOR NEW DIRECTORS

Ballroom C Integration Learning Projects Model

Mr. Brian Williams - Executive Director, Bethlehem AVTS

The Integrated Learning Projects model was developed to address academic deficiencies in students who attend our school. In the first year of implementation, this approach has served several students well, enabling them to recover academic credits through completing a rigorous integrated project while enrolled in the CTE Program. The integrated project encompasses the academic standards required to recover lost academic credit. The partnership between the sending high schools and BAVTS enables formal agreement as to the rigor and quality of the project(s) and to the worthiness of academic credit while at the same time permitting hours toward program completion at the CTC. Thus far the projects have served students with IEPs, but we are planning projects for all students who struggle academically. We plan to design generic integrated projects for each CTE program area that can be modified to meet the specific needs of each student. We now "recover" credit for seniors, but hope to address early on the patterns of younger students who struggle academically and put the projects into place as a preventive measure to help the students remain on a successful pathway toward program completion and ultimately graduation.

To assist and support new CTC instructors, CPAVTS implemented a program that provided a student teaching-like experience, by working directly in the classroom with new instructors for 40 days. All aspects of teaching were covered including classroom organization, discipline, time management, grading, lesson planning and teaching. The impact and results were overwhelmingly positive for all. This professional development initiative, using Perkins funds, has produced happy and productive first-time teachers. It has gone a long way to eliminate a lost first year for students who had to endure the struggles of a new instructor.

Ballroom C INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIPS PART III: THE CREATION OF FIRST EVER BIO-DIESEL MOTORCYCLE CHOPPER BUILT BY LANCASTER CTC STUDENTS AND STAFF

The Lancaster County Career & Technology Center (LCCTC) has completed Phase III of an industry partnership with local fuel company Worley/Obetz, and sister company, Amerigreen. The LCCTC presented two years ago on the alternative fuel buggies that were created to promote the use of alternative fuel sources. Last year they presented a bio-fuel processor that was built by the Auto Technology program to convert the used cooking oil used in the Culinary Arts program into a usable fuel. This year, the LCCTC and their industry partners raised the bar to a whole new level. They have created the first ever bio-diesel chopper-style motorcycle completely built by CTE students and staff. You must come see this one of kind machine that is a true representation of the level of quality of CTE students.

Although the initial stages require the most effort, the signature and update process is simple and quick. The system is unique and requires assistance to navigate for the first time.
